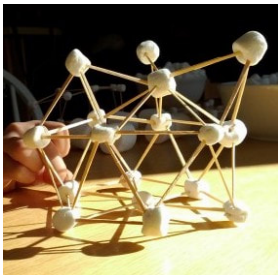


Register Today for Our Upcoming 4-H Events
