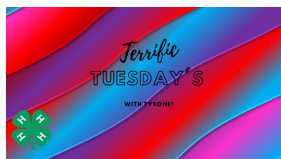
Wheat Variety Trial Results

Crop variety selection is one of the most important decisions that farmers make at the beginning of each growing season. Farmers look to Cooperative Extension's variety demonstrations for unbiased information to assist with variety selection. Annually the Extension staff of Camden, Chowan, Currituck, Gates, Pasquotank, and Perquimans Counties, in conjunction with local farm cooperators and seed companies, collaborate to implement variety trials for corn, soybeans, and wheat. Yield data is tabulated and presented to farmers allowing them to see how varieties performed on farms across the region. Results from the 2019-2020 wheat trials can be accessed here:
