Extension Provides Pesticide Safety and Education Classes

Farmers, as well as commercial pesticide applicators, who apply restricted use pesticides are required to obtain continuing education credits by attending approved classes. Cooperative Extension staff across the state offer educational opportunities, which cover topics such as pesticide safety and proper usage, annually to assist clientele. Despite having to do some things differently this year, in 2020 Camden Extension met the needs providing 19 hours of continuing education credit to 316 pesticide applicators through 11 classes/meetings.
